On 8/9/2016, a compliance inspection conducted by Inspect Minnesota, Midwest Soil Testing of the existing subsurface sewage treatment system (SSTS) at 8252 JAMACA AVE N determined that the system was non-compliant and presented an imminent threat to public health. The Washington County Department of Public Health & Environment issued orders that the SSTS problem be abated within 10 days and replaced, repaired or its use discontinued within three (3) months.

The three month (3) month compliance deadline of 12/20/2016 has passed, and as of the date of this correspondence, the Department has not received a permit application for the replacement of the SSTS. Please contact Joe Sanders at 651-430-6679 by 3/6/2019 and provide an update as to when the SSTS will be brought into compliance.

The Department recognizes that repairing or replacing an SSTS can seem like a daunting task. Financial assistance is available through Washington County in the form of low-interest loans and grants from low-income residents.
